Monica is a courageous woman who has struggled with many challenges and difficulties during her life. In November of 1992 and January 1993, she underwent brain surgery to correct life-threatening aneurysms. Her recovery was slow, and she continues to suffer from severe aphasia (severe language and communication disorder). The possibility of Monica being able to continue the life and work she loved was cut short by this tragedy in her life.
